The West African Institute for Financial and Economic Management (WAIFEM) is to hold a two (2) - day regional conference on post-crisis economic reforms in the West African sub-region from October 9 to 12, 2011 at the ECOWAS Secretariat, Abuja, Nigeria. Arrival is 9th October, 2011 while departure is October 12, 2011.

OBJECTIVE

The objective of the conference is to discuss policy lessons of the global financial crisis and to examine the impact of post-crisis economic reforms on relevant sectors of the economies of the sub-region. Given the importance of the
